Special Assistance to Maccabiah Athletes



Welcome Athletes and Coaches!

The Ministry of Immigrant Absorption welcomes you to Israel in the framework of the 2005 Maccabiah, and wishes you every success and achievement in whichever sports you may participate in.

Your visit to Israel is a wonderful opportunity to get to know the country, its vistas and people, and to strengthen your bonds with your heritage and with the Jewish People.

Many of your predecessors chose, as a result of their exciting visits to Israel, to explore options for making aliyah. A great number of them actually have made aliyah, become integrated, and make impressive contributions both to sport and to Israeli society.

If you would like to explore your own options for aliyah as a result of your participation in the 2005 Maccabiah, we offer detailed information about the assistance that is available to you from the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption, in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport.

The first section outlines the special assistance that has been earmarked for athletes and coaches that decide to make aliyah as a consequence of their participation in the 2005 Maccabiah. The remainder of the booklet presents the regular assistance available to all athletes and trainers that make aliyah.

For detailed information about assistance to new immigrants, consult the "Guide for the New Immigrant," available from the Publications Department. See the order form at the back of this booklet.





Note: The information contained in this booklet is based on data provided by various official sources. Details are subject to change. In case of any discrepancy, the regulations of the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption, the Ministry of Education, and other official bodies will prevail.

Special Assistance to Athletes

Assistance to Athletes that make Aliyah through Participation in the Maccabiah

Athletes that make aliyah through their participation in the Maccabiah can receive a special absorption package:

- Those who receive high marks in their sport, and that receive recognition by Israel's Olympic committee, can receive a monthly grant of NIS 2500 for 33 months.
- The Ministry of Immigrant Absorption will participate in the salaries of immigrants that are employed by Israeli sport organizations for a two-year period.
- Special courses are offered for athletes that are designed to help find employment in sports.



General Assistance to Athletes



The Ministry of Immigrant Absorption, in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport offers assistance to immigrant athletes and coaches. Professional athletes and coaches that wish to apply for assistance must first receive recognition as from the Ministry of Education as either an "Immigrant Athlete," or "Professional Immigrant Coach". Consult with the Sports Authority of the Ministry of Education and with the relevant professional associations. You must present documentation and authorization of your athletic career and achievements. On the basis of your documentation, and the recommendations of the professional associations, you will receive classification, if eligible, as either an Immigrant Athlete or a Professional Coach. Once you have received authorization of your classification from the Ministry of Education, you can then apply to the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption for assistance.

Note: you are invited to consult with a personal absorption counselor at a branch or district office of the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption in order to receive information and detailed explanations of the required documentation, necessary translations and notarized documents, and the like. Your personal absorption counselor will provide information, assistance, and guidance, throughout your absorption in Israel.

Assistance to eligible recognized athletes and trainers consists of a grant that is intended for acquiring sports equipment, clothing and shoes, for participation fees in athletic associations, or for medical treatment for sport-related medical conditions. The grant is given on a one-time basis only.





Coaches

In order to work as a professional coach it is necessary to receive certification from the Ministry of Education. Certification is granted on the basis of documentation of your qualifications and experience in your country of origin.

Persons who are not eligible for certification may nevertheless work as a coach, but may not teach sports or physical education in schools or other institutions supervised by the Ministry of Education.

Participation in Salaries

An immigrant coach can receive assistance from the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption towards funding of their salaries for one year, on condition that they are employed in a public-sector institution.

The period of eligibility for participation in salaries is 10 years from the date of aliyah.



Physical Education Instructors

Physical education instructors that wish to teach in Israeli schools must pass a certification course given by the Ministry of Education, and receive a teacher's certificate in the same manner as teachers of other subjects. The course is designed for teachers up to the age of 45, who are proficient in Hebrew at the *ulpan bet* level. The course lasts for 8 months, and the subjects covered include sport as a profession, Hebrew, managing a gym, physical education instruction for preschoolers, and swimming instruction.

At the conclusion of the course participants are awarded a teacher's certificate in sport as well as



three of the additional subjects, which will help to expand the possibilities of finding employment.

Eligible immigrants are entitled to a living allowance for the duration of the course. For details, consult with a personal absorption counselor.



Note: Each year from the 15th of May until the first of July, the Ministry of Education publishes information on openings for teachers in all subjects, including physical education and sports.

Special Assistance to Olympic Athletes

Immigrant athletes that are chosen to participate in the Olympics as part of Israel's delegation can be entitled to a monthly grant from the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption.

Athletes that achieve extraordinary results can receive additional grants from the "Fund for Athletic Achievement."

In addition, members of the Israeli Olympic delegations receive coverage for medical services, training, and overseas competitions in accordance with a program devised with the participation of each individual athlete.



Note that not every Olympic sport exists in Israel. Greater attention and more expansive funding is devoted to the following: badminton, basketball, trampoline, baseball, boxing, water-polo, volleyball, handball, wrestling, track and field, gymnastics,



rowing, kayaking, judo, riding, skiing, table-tennis, sailing, swimming, softball, shooting, archery, tennis, triathlon, taekwondo, weight-lifting, fencing, soccer, ice-hockey, and figure skating.

Addresses and telephone numbers of professional sport associations can be found at the back of this booklet. Included are those associations that are not recognized by the Olympic committee but are popular in Israel.

For more information and guidance on all aspects of absorption, contact a personal absorption counselor.



Accreditation of Degrees and Diplomas

The Ministry of Education Bureau for Evaluation of Foreign Academic Degrees and Diplomas (*HaLishka LeHa'arachat Toarim Academia'im VeDiplomot MiChu*) is the accrediting body in Israel for all foreign degrees.

Getting your overseas academic degrees and diplomas accredited in Israel can take up to several months. It is suggested that you begin tending to the matter, including the translation of certificates, immediately upon your arrival in the country, or even before. In order to obtain accreditation from the Bureau for Evaluation of Foreign Academic Degrees and Diplomas, you must take the following steps:

- Bring your original degree and course transcripts, as well as photocopies, to the Ministry of Education Bureau for Evaluation of Foreign Academic Degrees and Diplomas. See Useful Addresses. If you are unable to supply an original degree, you may be asked to obtain a "Letter of Eligibility" (*michtav zeka'ut*) from your university, detailing your entitlement to a degree.
- Complete an application form. Forms are available at the Bureau. Fill out only "Part A" of the form and attach the following documents:
 - An authenticated copy of the original degree certificate (diploma).
 - An authenticated copy of your university or college transcript from each institution where you have completed a degree. The transcript should include the following:
- Date of registration, date of commencement of studies, date of completion of studies.



- A transcript of all courses taken and credit points received.
- A summary of courses and prior studies that were recognized by the institution and earned credit points.
- Location of studies.
- Certificates that attest to prior study.
- Notarized Hebrew translations of the above documents, if the originals are in a language other than English.
- Bring your *te'udat zehut* with you.
- If you have changed your name, you will be required to include a marriage certificate or a notarized declaration of the change.
- Submit the application form and all the relevant documents listed above. You must submit all originals and photocopies. The Ministry will return originals to you.

Following the submission of your documents, there is no need to approach the Ministry of Education in person. Your accreditation will be sent by mail.



Child Athletes

Immigrant children between the ages of 10-17, who have made significant achievements in sport, may be eligible for one-time assistance according to the judgment of the appeals committee of the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption. Application is through a personal absorption counselor.



Finding Work

Assistance from the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption

Following the conclusion of Absorption Basket payments, new immigrants that are within their first year following aliyah, and that are either searching for employment or are unemployed, should register with the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption as “seeking employment,” and report to a personal absorption counselor. Your personal absorption counselor will work with you to devise an individual employment track that is tailored to your needs. Assistance can include access to job openings from the Ministry database, referrals to training and retraining courses as well as to Employment Centers for Olim, and participation in salaries. You can also receive assured income payments in accordance with family status. The frequency of visits to your absorption counselor is determined according to your personal employment program.

The Israel National Employment Service

The Israel National Employment Service, under the auspices of the Minister of Labor, Trade and Industry, refers job seekers to available jobs or to vocational training or retraining. It maintains two employment centers: the Labor Exchange (*Lishkat HaAvodah*) and the Center for the Placement of Professionals (*Mercaz LeTa’asukat Academa’im*). The Labor Exchange, located in every city in Israel, helps find work for people seeking skilled, semi-skilled, and unskilled jobs. If you do not have an academic degree from an institution of higher education, you should register with your local Labor Exchange. Notices of job vacancies are posted at Labor



Exchanges as they become available: job seekers are urged to check listings frequently.

The Center for the Placement of Professionals acts as an intermediary for academics, professionals, and potential employers. There are branch offices throughout the country.

The clerk at the Labor Exchange or Center for the Placement of Professionals will assign you to the appropriate coordinator. New immigrants without a profession are assigned to a special coordinator. Note that services of the Center for the Placement of Professionals and the Labor Exchange are free of charge.

If you wish to change your profession, you can request information about courses organized by the Ministry of Trade, Labor and Industry.



Note that it is only necessary to register with the Labor Exchange or the Center for the Placement of Professionals during your second year following aliyah. During your first year, you can be entitled to assured income payments during your job search from the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption. See above.

The National Employment Service also runs Vocational Guidance Centers (*Mercazim LeYiutz VeLeMeida Ta'asukati*) that offer individual guidance and job-seeking workshops. The centers also feature vocational libraries, computerized information systems, and assistance in preparing a curriculum vitae (resume). You may be able to receive a referral from the clerk at the Center for the Placement of Professionals or



the Labor Exchange. Note that some services may be for a fee. For more information, contact one of the counseling centers (see Useful Addresses).

Looking for Employment on Your Own

Beyond the assistance given by various official bodies, you will find in most cases that you will have to search for employment on your own. There are a number of steps you can take to facilitate your job search. You can limit yourself to just one or two, but the more avenues that you pursue, the more effective your search is likely to be.

- Newspaper help-wanted sections regularly advertise jobs in a variety of professions. While the English-language papers carry some ads, the majority is to be found in the Hebrew press. Many of these ads appear at least partially in English.
- There are a number of placement companies and headhunting agencies throughout the country. You can find them on the Internet and listed in the *Dapei Zahav* (Yellow Pages) phone directory. Many agencies also advertise their services in newspaper want-ad sections.
- Most companies and businesses in Israel have Websites, which often include listings of job openings or links to their personnel departments. Even if no specific positions are posted, it can often be worthwhile to research sites in order to probe any niches you might fit.
- The immigrant organizations can help you to locate prospective employers (see Useful Addresses). You can also consult AACI's on-line "Jobnet" site (www.jobnet.co.il), which contains job listings for a variety of professions.



Keep in mind that the more flexible you are about where you are willing to live, the more options you are likely to have.

It is important to note that Israelis feel comfortable about seeking employment by asking their friends and relatives for assistance. Many positions are filled by personal recommendations and word of mouth, so if you know people who might be in a position to help you find a job, do not hesitate to ask for their assistance, and follow up on any leads that they may offer. Many positions are filled without ever being advertised.

Hebrew

The importance of Hebrew ulpan as part of the absorption process cannot be overemphasized. The language skills you acquire in ulpan will benefit you through every phase of your absorption, including finding a place to live, looking for employment, and building relationships with veteran Israelis. During ulpan you will learn about and experience Israeli society, politics, and culture, while getting to know those institutions, authorities, and agencies that you will be dealing with in the future.

It is important to register at a Hebrew ulpan as soon as possible after obtaining new immigrant status in Israel. New immigrants are usually eligible to receive a subsidy of their ulpan study only within the initial 18 months following the date of aliyah.

In order to find out about ulpan options, consult your personal absorption counselor at a local office of the Ministry of Immigrant Absorption. Your counselor will confirm your eligibility for a subsidy of your ulpan study and refer you to non-residential, Ministry-approved ulpanim in your area.

Higher Education Studies in Israel



Israel's universities and regional colleges offer a wide range of disciplines.

Immigrant students may be eligible for tuition assistance and other aid from the Student Authority (see Useful Addresses). Contact the Student Authority for details on the types of aid available to you, and to clarify your eligibility for assistance.



Useful Addresses and Telephone Numbers



Telephone numbers and some addresses change frequently in Israel. Consult the latest telephone directory or information operator if you do not reach a number listed here. When a telephone number has been changed, there may not be a recorded message noting the change. Thus, if the number continues to be unanswered, check whether it is still in use.
